

An important point to remember when reading the gospels...

The content of a story is often more reflective of the time it was written than the time in which the story is set.

While the *events* of Jesus' ministry took place between c. 30 and 33 – the actual *recording* of those events only started a couple decades later.

Paul wrote his letters from c 48 to about 60.

Mark wrote the first gospel – the first 'biography' of Jesus – probably in the late 60's. He may have been familiar with some of Paul's work.

Matthew and Luke wrote at least a decade or two later, and John later still.

The point is that while the gospels are *set* in the early 30's, their underlying theological content is often reflective of thinking from the 60's – 90's.

Fun facts related to today's reading...

Jericho is one of the oldest known continually inhabited places on earth, with over 20 different layers of occupation dating to at least as 9000 BCE. It's sometimes described as the oldest fortified city in the world.

Due to the nearby Jordan River and many springs it's a surprisingly rich agricultural area, sometimes called the city of palms. (Not that there are really that many, but compared to the surrounding desert it's an oasis.)

The city of Jericho sits at one of the lowest places on earth, very near to the Dead Sea, at about 270m below sea level. Due to its low elevation it actually benefits from compressed oxygen levels – about 4% more oxygen than at sea level.

Jericho is in the Great Rift Valley that stretches from Central Africa, up the Red Sea, and up the Jordan Valley. This is a major fault zone, and explains why the region experiences significant seismic activity. Two well-known bible stories featuring Jericho both describe violent seismic-type events: when the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed in an extremely violent way, and when the Israelites under Joshua captured the city after the walls famously collapsed.
