

A note on worship...

Whether or not Jesus could actually read is a matter of heated debate among scholars. As I note in my message, even the gospel writers seem to disagree, with only Luke making the explicit claim that Jesus read from a scroll.

Modern evangelical scholars tend to take the biblical text fairly literally – so if Luke said that Jesus picked up a scroll and read from it then it must have been so.

Mainstream academics are generally sceptical of Luke's claim, pointing out that literacy was very low among working class people at that time, (3 - 5%) making it unlikely that carpenter's apprentices and fishermen were literate. Furthermore, as speakers of Aramaic, it was even less likely that they'd be literate in the original Hebrew of Isaiah (which almost no one could read by the first century), or the Koine Greek of the Septuagint translation.

Looking at the text from differing viewpoints can really change how one reads the bible. So, as much as we're able, we should try to be aware of all sides of ongoing scholarship. But for our purposes this morning, we'll take Luke's story at face value, as the point being made is less about Jesus' status and more about how Nazarenes approached their own spirituality.
